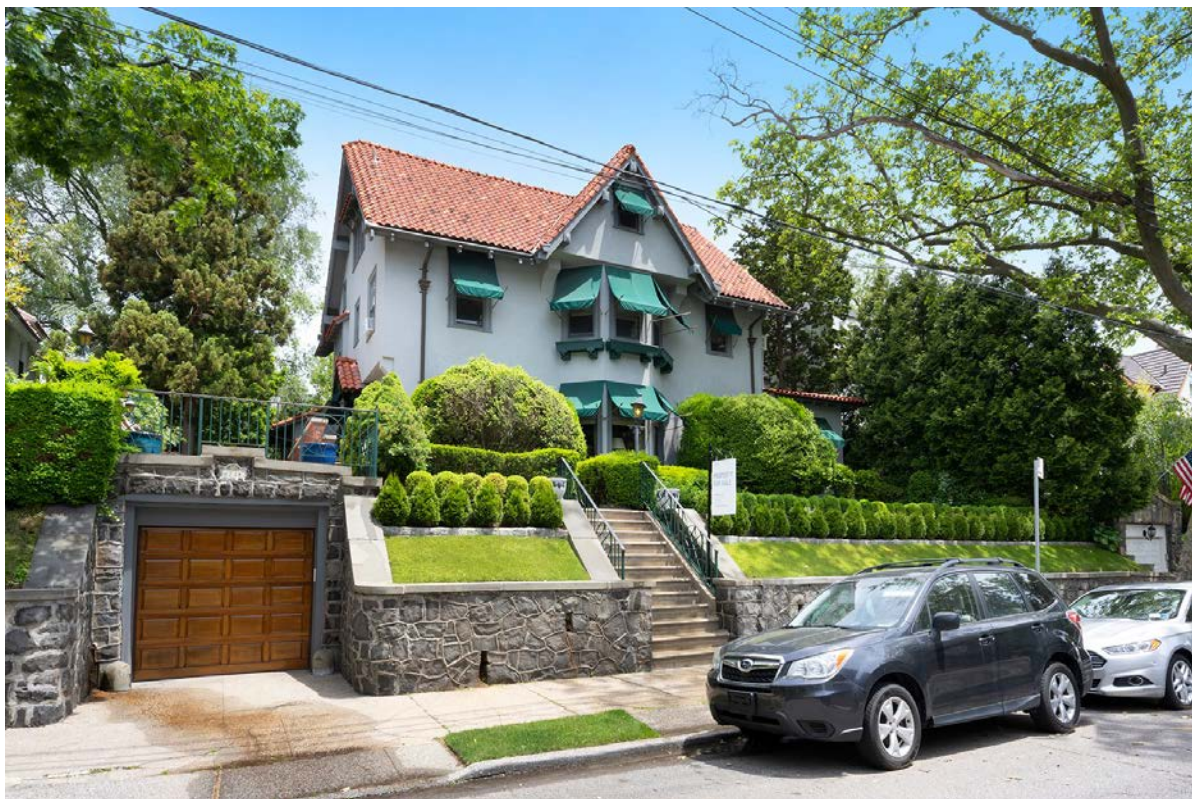




\$5.5M Arts & Crafts home in Bay Ridge

It's always fun to see the big, suburban homes of Bay Ridge, Brooklyn, with their varying architectural styles. This six-bedroom Arts & Crafts beauty is on the market for \$5.5 million, and it's certainly something different. Inside, a recent renovation restored period details from its construction in 1910 like coffered ceilings, marquetry floors, and built-ins, while adding modern takes on the style like barrel-vaulted ceilings and a wine cellar. Outside, the property feels like a magical garden, with a pool, waterfall, and fire pit.



The front and side yards provide even more outdoor space and tons of curb appeal. The entrance is off the side yard and opens into a spacious foyer. According to listing agent [Patrick Lilly](#) of CORE, “the interior inspiration came from the arts and crafts movement with an emphasis on William Morris, which includes both period wallpaper and overall design theme.”



A small music room then opens into the sitting room, which features a bay window and beamed ceilings. Overall, the house measures 4,500 square feet.

Adjacent is the large living room. The incredible barrel-vaulted ceilings are definitely the highlight, as is the stone fireplace. Oversized French doors open to the backyard.



The primary bedroom is on the second floor. It has an attached study, a nearly 200-square-foot dressing room lined with closets, and a luxurious en-suite bathroom. Also on this floor are two more bedrooms, a full bathroom, and a home office. There are three bedrooms, a full bathroom, and a den on the third level.



The lower level holds a large, open rec room, a laundry room, bathroom, and a temperature-controlled wine cellar and attached dining grotto.



The lower level leads right out to the two-car garage. Finally, the backyard feels extra enchanting thanks to vintage-style lanterns, a brick pathway, stone wall and waterfall, and large shady trees everywhere. Located in the exclusive Crescent Hill section of Bay Ridge, the home is less than two blocks from Shore Road Park, and the R train is available at 77th Street.
