

PRIVATE HOME TOUR TO CELEBRATE THE MARCH OF DIMES

CORE's Tom Postilio and Mickey Conlon hosted a private cocktail event benefitting March of Dimes at the home of legendary Grammy award winner David Sanborn and his wife Sofia.

The festive night was a gathering of high-end brokers to check out Sanborn's \$12 million on-the-market five-story townhouse, exclusively listed by Postilio and Conlon, which cost \$25k to build back in 1892. The Upper West Side home boasts five bedrooms, four wood-burning fireplaces and a recording studio on the top floor and features original details including pris-

tine millwork and hardwood inlaid floors that complement the modern amenities such as the chef's kitchen and spa-like baths.

A private garden on the ground floor and an outdoor terrace off the master bedroom create a quaint, majestic atmosphere for the event. Sanborn has a long history with the March of Dimes, and spoke to the organization's impact on children's health in America. 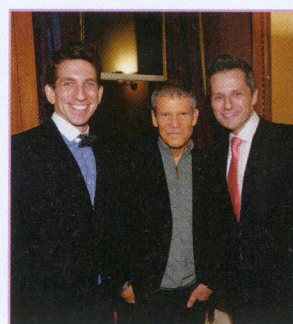
